When we see homeless people on the streets, we may think no one can help them. But here at HomeAgain, together with our partners from the Greater Richmond Continuum of Care, we are committed to better streamlining our services and making sure we offer assistance to those in need.

If you, or someone you know is...



Sleeping in a car



Sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation



Staying in an emergency shelter



Staying in a hotel/motel paid for by charitable organization or by a government program

Here's how to help



If you see someone on the streets or if you need a place to stay.

- Ask them if they have been to Homeless Point of Entry
- Instead of given them money, give them a bus pass to help them get safely to a shelter.



Anyone facing eviction with no other option should

- Call 2-1-1 or visit 211.org
- For anyone who has already been evicted, Homeless Point of Entry can direct you to the closest shelter



For those in need of help, but staying with family

- If you are living with family, we encourage you to make the arrangement work temporarily until you can secure housing.
- Call 2-1-1 or visit 211.org for assistance
